Swift Stations Continue to Turn a Brighter Hue of Blue

The *Swift* Blue Line stations are getting a facelift this summer with a new coat of high performance paint.

Thirteen of the 33 stations have been repainted. And the next group of 10 are prepped and ready to be painted at a rate of two per week.

Completed and reopened on 8/3:

- SB 99/Airport Rd (pictured)
- SB 99/148th St. SW

Beginning 8/6:

- SB 99/Lincoln Way (Stop #2780)
- SB 99/174th St. SW (Stop #2770)

During painting, the stations will be fenced and enclosed so the work can be done quickly and in an environmentally safe manner.

To catch a *Swift* bus at these locations, follow the signs to the nearby local stop the *Swift* bus will stop there. ORCA card readers and ticket vending machines will be unavailable, so please pay your fare when you deboard.

Seaway Transit Center Construction

Transit Center is Taking Shape

Landscaping, irrigation and finishing work on the mechanical building continues at Seaway Transit Center. Installation of Swift shelters could begin as early as next week.

Beginning Monday, Aug. 6, there will be periodic lane closures along 75th St. These intermittent, single lane closures will span one quarter to one half mile in length from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and move east from the Seaway Transit Center construction site to Hardeson Rd.



The lane closures will allow crews to install a wireless interconnect system for the area. This system will enable City of Everett traffic engineers to remotely view and control the new traffic signals at the transit center.

The installation for the wireless system should take about three weeks.

Sawcutting, demolition, drainage

The weekend of August 17 is the next scheduled weekend for installing in-lane bus pads. This may result in single lane closures as needed on northbound 180th, 196th, 208th and Canyon Park.
