

March 28, 2026 Service Change

Starting March 28, Community Transit will be making changes to bus service in Snohomish County. Riders will see changes to schedules and temporary detours on some routes. All riders should check their new schedule before March 28.

Changes to Routes	Routes impacted
Routes with notable schedule changes	101, 102, 109, 117, 209, Swift Green
Routes with more trips	201, 202, Swift Blue
Routes with fewer trips	ST 510, ST 515, 904

Changes by route

Route 101 (Mariner Park & Ride – Aurora Village Transit Center)

Route 101 will have a minor schedule change on weekday evenings.

- The last southbound trip from Mariner Park & Ride to Aurora Village Transit Center will leave 10 minutes later at 11:00 p.m.

This change is based on rider feedback and will make it easier for riders to make connections.

Route 102 (Edmonds Station - Lynnwood City Center Station)

Route 102 will have minor schedule changes on weekday evenings.

- Eastbound trips from Edmonds Station to Lynnwood City Center Station will leave a few minutes later to meet with the new Sounder train schedule.

This change will make it easier for Route 102 riders to make connections between the Sounder and bus.

Route 109 (Ash Way Park & Ride – Lake Stevens Transit Center)

Route 109 will have minor schedule changes throughout the day on weekdays. These schedule adjustments will help create more reliable service for riders.

Route 117 (Mukilteo Ferry – Lynnwood City Center Station)

Route 117 will have schedule changes on weekends to help riders who are connecting from the Mukilteo-Clinton Ferry to the bus.

- On Saturdays and Sundays, Route 117 trips will have 5-10 minute schedule changes throughout the day.
- These changes will make it so riders getting off the ferry won't have to wait as long for the bus.

These schedule changes will also improve connections to Route 103. These schedule adjustments are based on rider feedback about better connection to the ferry.

Changes by route continued

Routes 201 and 202 (Smokey Point Transit Center – Lynnwood City Center Station)

On weekend mornings, Routes 201 and 202 will have new morning trips.

- Saturday mornings:
 - Route 202 will have a new northbound trip from Lynnwood City Center Station to Smokey Point Transit Center starting at 5:44 a.m., which is 50 minutes earlier than current service.
 - The current Route 202 northbound trip that departs at 6:34 a.m. will depart 20 minutes earlier at 6:14 a.m.
- Sunday mornings:
 - Route 202 will have a northbound trip from Lynnwood City Center Station to Smokey Point Transit Center departing at 6:14 a.m., which is 50 minutes earlier than current service.
 - The 7:04 a.m. northbound trip from Lynnwood City Center Station to Smokey Point Transit Center will operate as Route 201 instead of Route 202.

These changes are being made to increase service and better serve riders traveling to the Arlington Amazon Fulfillment Center.

Route 209 (Smokey Point Transit Center – Lake Stevens Transit Center)

Route 209 will have minor schedule changes on southbound trips from Smokey Point to Lake Stevens Transit Center weekday afternoons. These schedule adjustments will help create more reliable service for riders.

Route 904 (Marysville – Lynnwood City Center Station)

On weekday mornings, Route 904 will have one fewer trip on weekday mornings.

- The southbound trip at 9:17 a.m. from Marysville to Lynnwood City Center Station will be eliminated
- The last southbound trip will now be the trip leaving Marysville at 8:44 a.m.

This trip is being eliminated due to low ridership, so we can provide more service to routes with more riders.

Swift Blue Line (Everett Station – Shoreline North/185th Station)

On Sundays, Swift Blue Line will have two new trips added.

- On Sunday mornings, one new southbound trip from Everett Station to Shoreline North/185th Station will be added 20-minutes earlier in the morning, leaving Everett at 5:40 a.m.
- On Sunday evenings, one new southbound trip from Everett Station to Shoreline North/185th Station will be added 20-minutes later in the evening, leaving Everett at 10:20 p.m.

These changes are being made to create earlier and later weekend Swift Blue Line trips for riders.

Swift Green Line (Seaway Transit Center – Canyon Park Park & Ride)

On Sundays, Swift Green Line will have later evening service.

- On Sunday evenings, one new northbound trip from Canyon Park Park & Ride to Seaway Transit Center will be added 20-minutes later in the evening, leaving Canyon Park at 9:25 p.m.
- On Sunday evenings, one new southbound trip from Seaway Transit Center to Canyon Park Park & Ride will be added 20-minutes later in the evening, leaving Everett at 9:21 p.m.
- On Sundays, from 1-2 p.m. Swift Green Line buses will arrive every 20 minutes instead of every 15 minutes.

These changes are being made to create later Swift Green Line trips for riders on Sundays.

Changes by route continued

Route ST 510 (Everett Station – Seattle)

On weekdays, Route ST 510 will have fewer trips and minor schedule changes.

- From 5:30 – 7:30 a.m. buses traveling southbound from Everett to Seattle will arrive every 15 minutes instead of every 12 minutes.
- From 2:30 – 6:30 p.m., buses traveling northbound from Seattle to Everett will arrive every 20 minutes instead of every 15 minutes.

These changes are being made to adjust for increased traffic from Revive I-5, as well as to improve reliability for riders.

Route ST 515 (Lynnwood City Center Station - Seattle)

On weekdays, Route ST 515 will have fewer trips and minor schedule changes.

- From 5:55 – 7:55 a.m., buses traveling southbound from Lynnwood to Seattle will arrive every 15 minutes instead of every 10 minutes.
- From 3 – 6 p.m., buses traveling northbound from Seattle to Lynnwood will arrive every 15 minutes instead of every 10 minutes.

These changes are being made to adjust for increased traffic from Revive I-5, as well as to improve reliability for riders.

Link 2 Line Crosslake Connection - Opening March 28, 2026

More exciting news for local transit riders! On Saturday March 28, Link 2 Line Crosslake Connection will open—providing riders with light rail service across Lake Washington.

What this means for light rail riders:

- The 2 Line will operate between Lynnwood and Redmond, in addition to the 1 Line between Federal Way and Lynnwood.
- Combined 1 Line and 2 Line headways between Lynnwood and International District/Chinatown will be every 4 minutes, providing additional capacity through the busy core of the system.
- Riders boarding Link light rail at stations between Lynnwood City Center station and International District/Chinatown may board either a 1 Line or 2 Line train.
- Riders continuing beyond International District/Chinatown must board the correct line. 1 Line trains continue south to Federal Way, while 2 Line trains travel east toward Mercer Island and Bellevue.
- Riders are encouraged to check the signage on an arriving train to confirm it serves their destination.
